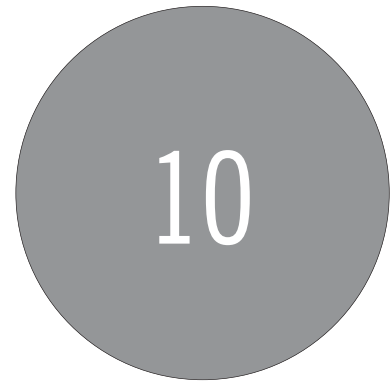
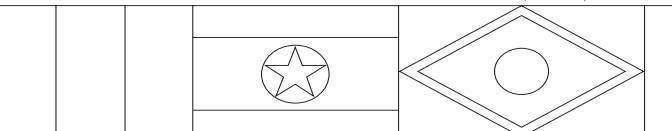

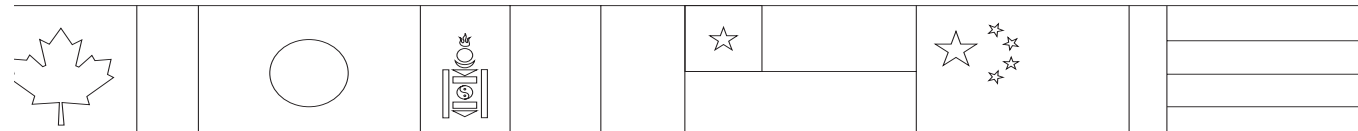

Subthemes:

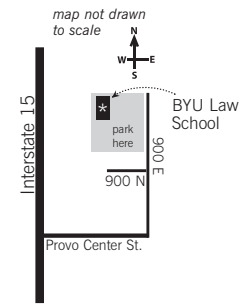
- *Religious Pluralism, Security and Human Rights*
